To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Edmund King of Shelby County, Alabama, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Mobile, Alabama, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said Edmund King,

according to the provisions of the act of Congress of the 34th of April, 1830, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the fraction N. of fractional section twenty nine, in fractional Township, north of the fraction N. of fractional section twenty nine, in the District of Land subject to sale at Mobile, Alabama, containing forty five acres, and twenty five hundredths of an acre, according to the official plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Edmund King.

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents, do give and grant, unto the said Edmund King, and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging, unto the said Edmund King, and to his heirs and assigns forever.
