Before me, the undersigned authority, a Notary Public, State of Large, personally appeared Nobie Davidson, an unmarried woman, who, known to me, did upon her oath depose and say:

My name is Nobie Davidson. I am the widow of Robert B. Davidson, Jr., who passed away several years ago while residing at Helena, Alabama. My said late husband purchased the property on which I now reside from W. J. Strickland, July 31, 1959. I have resided on the said property more than ten consecutive years, except that March 4, 1976, I conveyed a small portion of it to the Helena Baptist Church, as recorded Deed Ecok 297, Page 439, in the Shelby County Probate Office. The said property purchased from W. J. Strickland July 31, 1959, is described as follows:

Beginning on the North side of the Pelham-Helena road at the Southwest corner of Rual Stark's lot, marked by a fence; thence run North along the West line of said Rual Stark's lot, marked by a fence, for a distance of 263 feet, more or less, to the Baptist Church Lot; run thence West along the South line of the Baptist Church Lot for a distance of 75 feet; run thence South to the North line of the Pelham-Helena Road; run thence East along the North line of the Pelham-Helena road for a distance of 94 feet to the point of beginning, situated Shelby County, Alabama.

The property west of and adjoining the property described above was also owned by W. J. Strickland, who conveyed the same in two segarate parcels by two separate deeds, one of which was to G. T. Firmatrick. The parcel W. J. Strickland conveyed to G. T. Kirkpatrick is situated in the northeast corner of the intersection of Main Street (in Helena-Pelham Road (Shelby County Highway #52). The title to the other portion, or northern part of the property referred to, formerly owned by W. J. Strickland, passed through mesne conveyances, thence to The Helena Baptist Church. The west line of my Frequency described above is the east boundary of the parcel owned by G. T. Kirkpatrick and is the east boundary of a portion of land owned to The Helena Baptist Church.

The property conveyed by W. J. Strickland to my late husband, Esters E. Daridson, Jr., which property is described above and which is rescrided in Deed Book 205, page 343, in the Shelby County Probate Cifice, does not overlap or conflict with the eastern boundary of any Friggray owned by G. T. Kirkpatrick or that of the Helena Baptist There has never been any dispute concerning the location of the boundary lines or the ownership of our respective properties.
