County, Alabama, James Jackson Isbell and wife, Ella Elizabeth Isbell,

conveyed to me and my husband, the following described property:

INW of the NEW of Section 5, Tp. 13, Range I East, in Shelby County, Alabama, less the following described property; Begin at the NE corner of the NW of the NEW of Section 5, Tp. 13, Range I East, and run West along the Northern boundary of said forty to the branch; thence in a South and Southeasterly direction down the center of said branch to a point where the branch intersects the East boundary line of the above described forty; thence North along the East boundary line of said forty to the point of beginning. Containing 5 acres, more or less.

It was the intention of James Jackson Isbell and wife to convey a total of 35 acres, being all cf that part of the above-described Quarter Quarter section lying south and west of the branch as described.

My husband and I went into immediate possession of the property as conveyed. We moved into the house situated on the property, and I have lived on the property to the current date. Portions of the property are under fence, and through the years, portions of the land have been farmed and used for pasture. My daughter, Donna Gay Isbell, is a single woman, 18 years of age, whose disabilities of non-age have been removed by decree of the Circuit Court of Shelby County, Alabama, as recorded in Miscellaneous Book 18, page 140, in the office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama.

I have known the use and possession of the herein-above described property as conveyed to me and my husband by James Jackson Isbell and wife, for more than 20 years, and I have never heard the title questioned or disputed in any way, and I have never heard the title of our predecessors in title questioned in any way.

Since the time that I first knew the said land it has been owned by the undersigned affiant and my predecessors in title and has been occupied by us actually, exclusively, openly, notoriously, hostilely and continuously, and, as stated, I have never heard my title or of my predecessors in title questioned in any way.
