Before me, a Notary Public in and for said County and State, personally appeared B. B. Curry, who is known to me, and who being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:

My name is B. B. Curry and I reside at Wilton, Shelby County, Alabama, where I have resided since 1913.

When I first came to Wilton in 1913, Mr. D. D. (Dave) Woolley was in possession of, and lived in a house situated on, a parcel of land situated at the Southwest intersection of Birmingham Street and the Old Montevallo-Selma Road. It is my understanding that Mr. Woolley acquired an adjoining parcel in the year 1928, and I will make this affidavit applicable to both parcels subsequent to 1928, said property being more particularly described as follows:

PARCEL ONE

Begin at the NW corner of Lot 15 in Block 3, as shown on map of J. E. Bozeman, Civil Engineer, as prepared for Maj. Joseph Hardie, being the map of One Hundred Acres at Birmingham Junction or E.T.V. and G. Railroad, said map being recorded in Deed Book 14 at page 239, Office of Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama, and run thence South along the West line of said Lot 15, 260 feet; thence run East 1100 feet to the Montevallo (Old Selma Road); thence run along said Montevallo Road to the intersection thereof with the South side of Birmingham Street, as shown on said map of C. E. Bozeman; thence run along the South side of said Birmingham Street (and along the North lines of Lots 31, 29, 27, 25, 23, 21, 19, 17, and 15 to the point of beginning, and containing 8 acres, more or less.

PARCEL TWO

Begin at a point 260 feet South of the Northwest corner of Lot 15 in Block 3, as shown on said map of J. E. Bozeman recorded in Deed Book 14 at page 239, Office of Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama, and run thence South along the West line of Lot 15 and along the West line of Lot 16, 566 feet and 8 inches to the Southwest corner of said Lot 16; thence run East along the South lines of said Lot 16, Lot 18, and Lot 20 in said Block 3 to said Montevallo (Old Selma Road); thence run Northeasterly along said Montevallo Road to an iron stake (being the Southeast corner of Parcel One, as described above); run thence West 1100 feet along the South line of said Parcel One to the point of beginning, and containing 8 acres, more or less.

Said Dave Woolley and his wife, Mrs. Zuella Woolley, lived and resided in their home on said property until the time of their respective deaths, and their daughter, Carrie Mae Woolley, continued to live and reside in said house on said property until her death, which occurred about a year ago.

The Wilton Water Works Project Lot is situated North of the above described property, across Birmingham Street from said property.

It is my understanding that a small parcel of the above described parcel was conveyed to Southeastern District of the Christians and Missionary Alliance about the year 1956, and a small building was constructed on said parcel by Carrie Mae Woolley for said Southeastern District of the Christians and Missionary Alliance about 1956 or 1957, but said building was torn down and removed from said property within a year or two thereafter. Said Southeastern District of the Christians and Missionary Alliance has not occupied or possessed said parcel, nor any part of the above described property, for more than the past fifteen years in any manner whatsoever, either by having a building located on said property, or otherwise. I know of my own personal knowledge that said D. D. (Dave) Woolley and his family, and their successors in title, have been in the open, continuous, notorious, undisturbed, peaceable, exclusive, hostile, actual adverse possession of the above described property since 1928 and until the present date. Said property has been used exclusively as the homeplace of said D. D. (Dave) Woolley, and his family since 1928 until the present date, they having in the past grown various vegetables and agricultural crops on said property from time to time.
