Before me, William F. Cooch, the undersigned authority, personally appeared Mr. W. W. Crim, who, being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says: My name is W. W. Crim. I am 54 years of age and have been a resident of Shelby County all my life. I have been familiar with the ownership and possession of the following described land for more than 25 years.

A parcel of land situated in Shelby County more particularly described as follows:

The North 10 acres of the southwest quarter of the southwest quarter ($SW\frac{1}{4}$ of $SW\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 29, Township 21 South, Range 2 West.

Less and except the right of way for I-65 and right of way for access road.

I think Mr. Hinton owned the described land when I was just a small boy and as I remember, the land was not used for anything other than timber land. My brother C. R. Crim has owned land all around the described land and I have crossed the described land to get to my brothers land. I think my brother negotiated with Mr. J. O. Wise one time to buy the described land, but for some reason didn't buy it. The State of Alabama condemned a portion of this land for Interstate Highway #65 and later condemned another portion of it for an off ramp. The state also acquired an easement adjacent to the east side of the freeway for an access road. This access road now provides access to some of my brothers land.

To my knowledge, no one has made any claim of title to this land, or exercised any acts of possession except LaJuana S. Stubbs and husband, Thomas W. Stubbs, Jr. and their predecessors in title, and they have for more than 25 years been in actual, open, notorious, hostile, continuous and exclusive possession of the above described land.
