Luck and through and by virtue of deed recorded in Deed Book 302, page 764 in the Probate Office of Shelby County, Alabama; that during the time of plaintiffs ownership, they have been in actual, peaceable, adverse possession of said lands claiming to own the same, and that title to said lands has stood in plaintiff's names on the records in the Office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, Alabama, for more than ten years prior to this date. Higdon, and that the names, ages and addresses of any other parties who, unknown to plaintiffs, may claim an interest in or to the above described property, are unknown.
