ARTICLE III

I direct that if at my death I own any common stock in either Alabama By Products Corporation or Alabama Chemical Products Company, that my Executors first offer to sell said stock to BURGESS A. THOMASSON and ALBERT F. THOMASSON equally, if they shall survive me, or to the survivor of them, at my cost, and if neither said BURGESS A. THOMASSON nor ALBERT F. THOMASSON desire to purchase said stock, then said stock shall be offered for sale to MRS. A. P. THOMASSON at my cost. If neither Mrs. Thomasson nor her two sons exercise their option to purchase said stock then my Executors are hereby directed to obtain the highest possible price for said stock by sale to others.

ARTICLE IV

A. All of the rest, residue and remainder of the property which I may own at the time of my death, real, personal and mixed, tangible and intangible, of whatsoever nature and wheresoever situated, including all lapsed legacies and devises, I give, devise and bequeath to MARGARET GAGE SMITH and MARGARET WALLACE STRAHLEY, in fee, equally, share and share alike, or if one of them shall predecease me then all to the survivor of them. In order to create additional cash for distribution to the beneficiaries of the residuary of my estate, I direct that all real property and all furniture, paintings, rugs, carpets, clothes, silver, jewelry, china and other personal effects belonging to me at the time of my death not otherwise specifically devised or bequeathed herein, including all lapsed legacies and devises, are to be sold by my Executors at private or public sale/sales or auction/auctions, the method and time and all other details of said sale to be within the exclusive discretion of my said Executors.

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B. If any residuary beneficiary hereunder shall not have reached his or her twenty-first birthday at the time a share of this estate is required to be distributed to him or her under the above provisions, the share of such beneficiary shall be retained in trust by the trustees until he or she reaches such birthday. During such time the trustees shall pay to such beneficiary or extend on his or her behalf so much of the net income derived from that particular fund as the Trustees may deem advisable to provide properly for the maintenance, education and support of such beneficiary and may incorporate any income not so dispersed into the principal of the fund. When each such beneficiary shall reach his or her twenty-first birthday, the trust shall terminate as to such beneficiary and the Trustees shall distribute his or her fund to such beneficiary in fee.

ARTICLE V

I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my daughter, GAGE BUSH ENGLUND, and SYDNEY R. PRINCE, III, to be Executors of this my Last Will and Testament and Trustees of all trusts created hereunder. I direct that neither Executor or Trustee shall be required to furnish any bond, or other security in any jurisdiction, or if a bond be required, neither shall be required to furnish any sureties thereon. I do further exempt my said Executors and Trustees from filing in any Court or with any official an inventory of my estate, from rendering any accounting, and from making any final accounting of my estate. If my daughter GAGE BUSH ENGLUND, or SYDNEY R. PRINCE, III, shall predecease me, or for any reason fail to qualify as Executor or Trustee hereunder (or having qualified shall die or resign) then in such event the other shall act as sole Executor/Trustee of my estate; and in such capacity shall possess and exercise all powers and authority herein conferred on the Executors/Trustees. If both my daughter, GAGE BUSH ENGLUND, and SYDNEY R. PRINCE, III, shall predecease me or for any

reason shall fail to qualify as Executor/Trustee hereunder (or having qualified, shall die or resign) then in such event, THE FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF BIRMINGHAM shall act as sole Executor/Trustee of my estate; and in such capacity shall possess and exercise all powers and authority herein conferred on the Executors/Trustees jointly.

ARTICLE VI

I hereby grant to my Executors and also to the Trustees of any trust established hereunder the continuing, absolute, discretionary power to deal with any property, real or personal, held in my estate or in any trust, as freely as I might in the handling of my own affairs. Such power may be exercised independently and without the prior or subsequent approval of any court or judicial authority, no person dealing with the Executors or Trustees shall be required to inquire into the propriety of any of their actions. Without in any way limiting the generality of the foregoing, I hereby grant to my Executors and also to any Trustee hereunder the following specific powers and authority in addition to and not in substitution of powers conferred by law:

To compromise, settle, or adjust any claim or demand by or against my estate or any trust and to agree to any rescission or modification of any contract or agreement; to retain any security or other property owned by me at the time of my death, so long as such retention appears advisable, to exchange any such security or property for other securities or properties and to retain such items received in exchange; (I have confidence in the securities owned by me at the time of my death and no sale thereof shall be made solely in order to diversify investments); to sell, exchange, assign, transfer and convey any security or property, real or personal, held in my estate or in any trust fund, at public or private sale, at any time and price and upon such terms and conditions (including credit) as it may

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determine; to invest and reinvest in such stocks, bonds and other securities and properties as it may deem advisable, including stocks and unsecured obligations, undivided interests, interests in investment trusts, mutual funds, legal and discretionary common trust funds, leases, and property which is outside of my domicile, all without diversification as to kind or amount without being restricted in any way by the Constitution of Alabama, any statute or court decision (now or hereafter existing) regulating or limiting investments by fiduciaries; to register and carry any property in its own name or in the name of its nominee or to hold it unregistered, but without thereby increasing or decreasing its liability as fiduciary; to sell or exercise any "rights" issued on any securities held in my estate or in any trust fund hereunder; to consider and treat as corpus all dividends payable in stock, all dividends in liquidation and all "rights" issued on securities (provided, however, that all dividends on shares of mutual funds derived from realized capital gains shall be treated as corpus) and to consider and treat as income all other dividends received (except those declared and payable as of a "record date" preceeding my death, which shall be considered and treated as corpus); to charge or credit to corpus any premiums and discounts on securities purchased at more or less than par; to vote in person or by proxy any stock or securities held, and to grant such proxies and powers of attorney to such persons as it may deem proper; to consent to and participate in any plan for the liquidation, reorganization, consolidation or merger of any corporation, any security of which is held; to borrow money (from itself individually or from others) upon such terms and conditions as it may determine and to mortgage and pledge estate and trust assets as security for the repayment thereof; to lease any real estate for such term or terms and upon such conditions and rentals and in such manner as it may deem advisable, and any lease so made shall be valid and binding for the full term thereof even though same shall extend beyond the duration of the trust; to make repairs, replacements and improvements, structural or otherwise, to any such real estate and to charge the expense

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thereof to principal or income (or apportion same between principal and income) as it may deem proper; to subdivide real estate, to dedicate same to public use and to grant easements as it may deem proper; whenever required or permitted to divide and distribute my estate or any trust created hereunder; to make such division or distribution in money or in kind or partly in money and partly in kind; and to exercise all powers herein conferred, after the termination of any trust until the same is fully distributed; to employ accountants, attorneys and such agents as it may deem advisable; to pay reasonable compensation for their services and to charge same to (or apportion same between) income and principal as it may deem proper.
