I am 52 years of age and have been a resident of Shelby County for 52 years. I have been familiar with the ownership and possession of the herein described land for more than 27 years.

I remember that in about 1951 Mr. S. W. Smyer bought the captioned property from Mr. C. H. Kicker and Mr. Smyer used the land to grow timber, farmed some of it, sold chert off the land and cut and sold the timber off of it.

In about 1955, Mr. Smyer deeded the property to his son, S. W. Smyer, Jr. who was married to Ingrid Smyer. They grew timber on the property and most of it was woodlands that just lay idle.

After S. W. Smyer, Jr. and Ingrid divorced, the property was conveyed to Ingrid Smyer in about 1973. Ingrid has continued to grow timber on the property but it has just lay idle in woodsland during this time.
