Before me, a Notary Public in and for said County and State, personally appeared Ocie D. Vernon, who is known to me, and who being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:

My name is Ocie D. Vernon. I am 71 years of age and have been a resident of Shelby County, Alabama, all of my life.

I have been familiar with the ownership and possession of the following described property for more than the past thirty years:

Commencing at the intersection of the East boundary of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 3, Township 24 North, Range 13 East, with the South boundary of the right of way of the Montevallo-Calera Highway; run thence in a Southwesterly direction along the South boundary of said highway right of way a distance of 210 feet; thence South and parallel with the East boundary of said NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ a distance of 315 feet; thence run in a Northeasterly direction and parallel with the South boundary of said Highway 210 feet to the East boundary of said NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$; run thence North along said East boundary of said NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of NW $\frac{1}{4}$, 315 feet to the point of beginning.

When I first remember said property it was owned by Mrs. Della Glass and her husband, Buddy Glass. There was a house located on said property at that time in which Mr. and Mrs. Glass were living; Mr. and Mrs. Glass continued to live in said house on said property until said house burned approximately 2 years ago; they had sold and conveyed said house and a portion of said property to their nephew, Levis Glass and his wife, Ruby Glass, but they had been allowed to remain to live in said house after such conveyance.

Mrs. Della Glass and her husband, Buddy Glass, sold and conveyed the remaining portion of the above described property (being an "L" shaped lot) to their son, Edward Glass, who in turn sold and conveyed said "L" shaped lot to Henry O. Young, who in turn sold and conveyed said "L" shaped lot to Jack Glass; said Jack Glass then sold and conveyed said "L" shaped lot to his cousin, Levis Glass and his wife, Ruby Glass. There was a building situated on said "L" shaped lot at the time when Edward Glass bought the same from his parents; said building was used for a time as a refrigerator repair shop before it burned about 2 weeks after the house referred to above burned.

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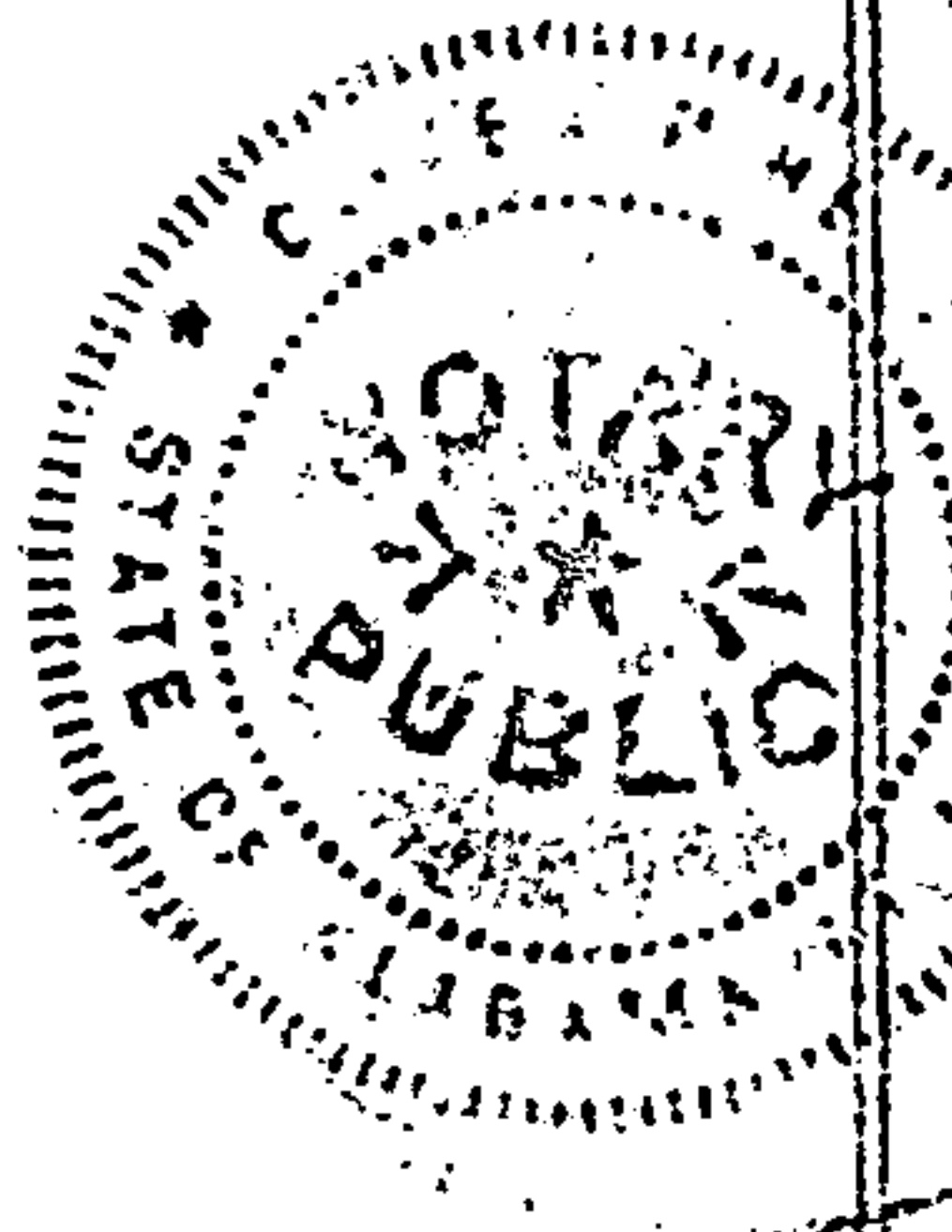
