My name is Willie C. Hiel, and I am 68 years of age and I reside at Calera, Shelby County, Alabama.

I have heretofore made an affidavit on or about the 8th day of July, 1978 concerning the property of the Calera Masonic Lodge. I have been told that the affidavit that I made was not detailed enough and have been requested to furnish additional information concerning the properties of the Calera Masonic Lodge, which is more particularly described as: Lot No. 3, Block 275 of the J. H. Dunston Map and Survey of the Town of Calera, Alabama.

As I stated in my previous affdavit, that property belongs to the Calera Masonic Lodge.

The Calera Masonic Lodge acquired the property from eleste Binkerhoff Timothy and a small interest from Elizabeth Eason Hoover.

The property originally belonged to T. C. or Thomas Cook McKibbon who died in 1944. In his will, Mr. McKibbon left the property to three of his sisters, that is, Mae McKibbon who died early in 1948, Fay Victoria McKibbon who died in early 1951 and Lizzie McKibbon Binkerhoff who died prior to her brother, Thomas Cook McKibbon, on December 11, 1890. The three sisters were survived by a fourth sister, Julia McKibbon Boyd who died on July 29, 1951. I understand that Julia McKibbon Boyd left a will leaving the property to Celeste Binkerhoff Timothy, who was the daughter of Lizzie McKibbon Binkerhoff. Also, an interest was left to Elizabeth Eason Hoover who was the daughter of Fay McKibbon. Elizabeth Hoover and Celeste Timothy both conveyed their interest in and to the properties to the Masonic Lodge who now owns the property and I have never heard of anyone other than the Masonic Lodge claim any interest in and to the property other than the heirs of Thomas Cook McKibbon, who have now conveyed their

By way of summary, Thomas Cook McKibbon, also known as T.C. McKibbon owned the property and he left it to three of his four sisters, or the the survivor of them. The three sisters dies and were survived by Julia McKibbon Boyd, who left a will conveying the property to Elizabeth Eason Hoover who was the daughter of one of the sisters and Celeste Binkerhoff Timothy who was a daughter of one of the sisters.

The order in which the heirs of Thomas Cook McKibbon died is as follows: Lizzie McKibbon Binkerhoff, mother of Celeste Binkerhoff Timothy died prior to Thomas Cook McKibbon, on December 11, 1890. Thomas Cook McKibbon died in 1944, Mae Windser McKibbon died in 1948, Faye Victoria McKibbon Eason died in 1951 and Julia McKibbon Boyd died in 1951 and Celeste Binkerhoff Timonth died in the past few years and I do not remember exactly what year she died.
