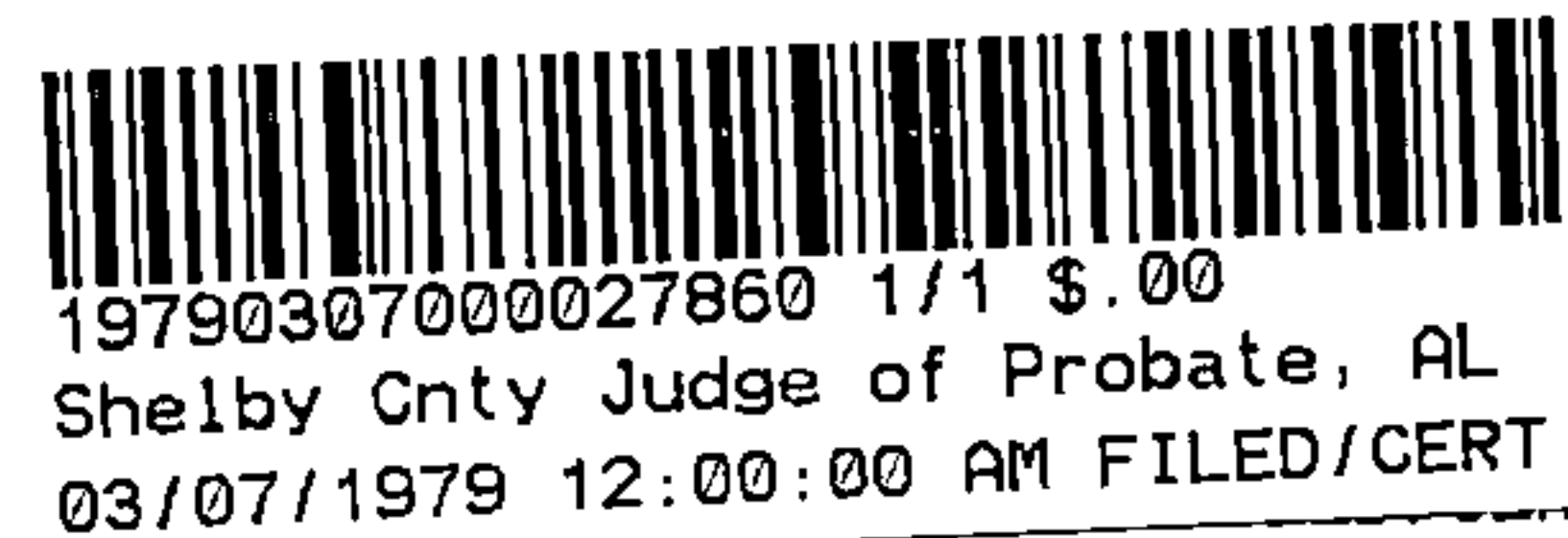

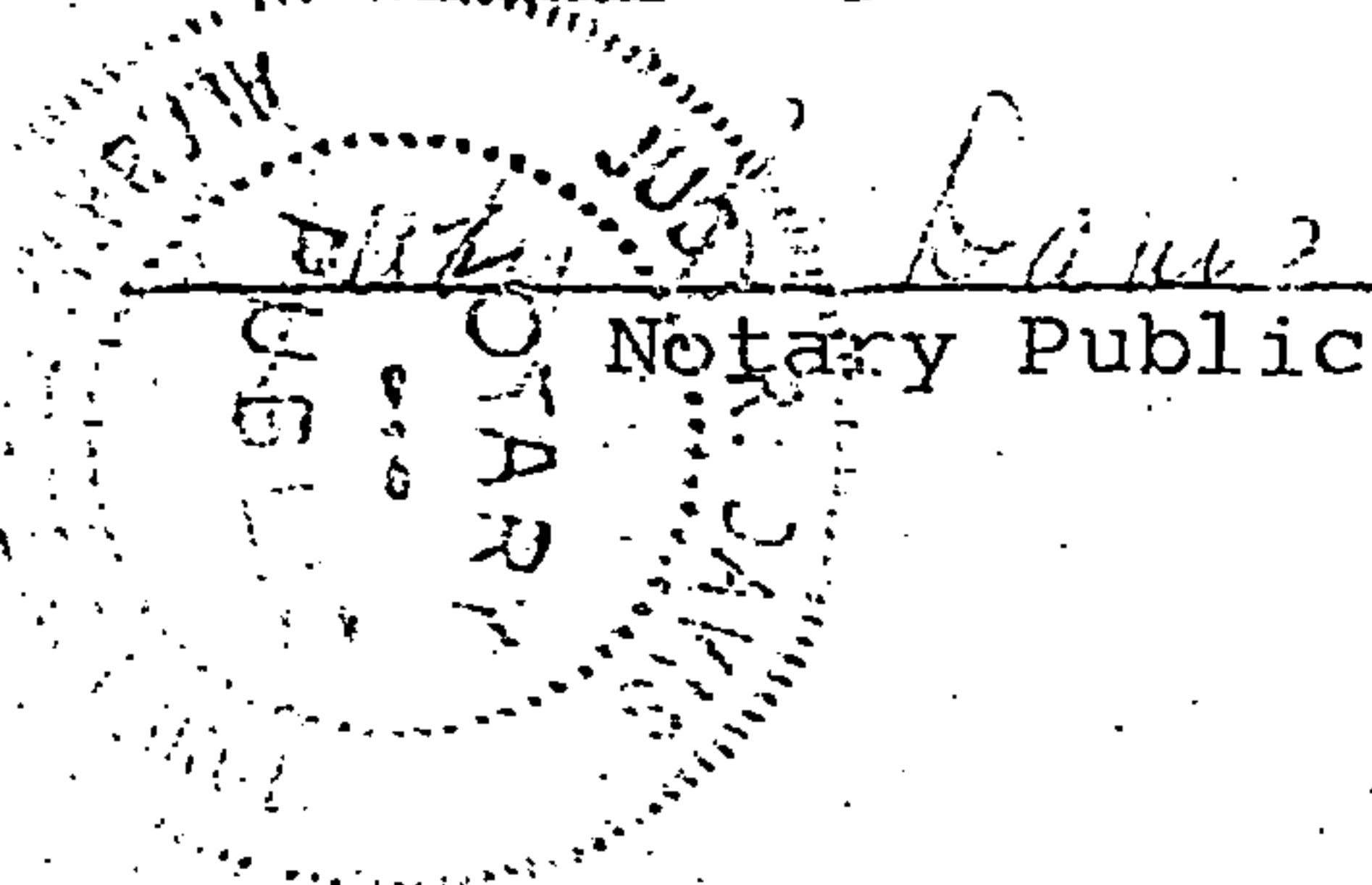
Before me, the undersigned authority, in and for said County and State, personally appeared MARY NELL MILSTEAD SKELTON, who, being known to me and being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:

My name is Mary Nell Milstead Skelton. I am over the age of 21.. I am the daughter of Arthur Milstead and Onzelle Verchot Milstead. My mother and father are both deceased. My mother died intestate in the year 1938 and my father approximately six years thereafter. The only children ever born to my mother and father were myself and two sisters, namely, Eloise Milstead Williams, who is now a widow, and Eleanor J. Milstead who died at nine months of age.

In May of 1968, my sister, Eloise Williams, who was then a widow, myself and my husband, B.L. Skelton conveyed to the Water Works Board of the Town of Columbiana, Alabama, 0.36 acres, plus an easement. In certain deeds that was conveyed earlier by my mother and father in the 1930's, in Section 26, Township 21, Range 1 West in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ , there was an exception to grantors' interest in what is known as the "Verchot Cemetery" on said land, and the title to said cemetery land and rights of burial therein were reserved and excepted, but said cemetery has no connection with and is across Alabama Highway #25 from said easement granted to Water Works Board of the Town of Columbiana, Alabama. The Verchot Cemetery is near subject property but in no way touches or overlaps the property that was conveyed to the Water Works Board of the Town of Columbiana, Alabama.
