
AGREEMENT



29th day of August, 1979, between Agreement made the Kimberly-Clark Corporation, and John T. Batson and J. L. Batson, III.

In Consideration of the Timber Deed executed by John T. Batson, a single man, James L. Batson, III and wife, Marie Batson, James L. Batson, Jr. and wife, Elizabeth Smith Batson, to Kimberly-Clark Corporation, dated the 29th day of August, 1979, Kimberly-Clark Corporation agrees to the following conditions governing its right to cut timber under said Timber Deed on the S½ of Section 25, Township 20 South, Range 1 East, Shelby County, Alabama:

- Kimberly-Clark Corporation shall conduct logging operations so as to preserve survey lines on said property.
 - 2. Kimberly-Clark Corporation shall protect the environment by conducting its operations so as to prevent debris from entering water courses on said land. In the event that debris resulting from Kimberly-Clark Corporation's logging operations enters water courses in amounts which may adversely affect the natural flow of the stream, Kimberly-Clark Corporation shall remove such debris as soon as practicable. When the flow in a water course is necessarily diverted by Kimberly-Clark Corporation's activities, such flow shall be restored through the natural course as soon as practicable. Kimberly-Clark Corporation shall perform logging operations in a manner reasonably calculated to minimize soil erosion. Damage resulting from Kimberly-Clark Corporation's logging due to failure to protect from erosion shall be repaired by Kimberly-Clark Corporation.
 - 3. Kimberly-Clark Corporation shall indemnify and hold harmless said John T. Batson and J. L. Batson, III against all claims, damages, losses, and expenses including attorneys' fees



arising out of or resulting from the performance of the logging operations caused in whole or in part by any negligent act or omission of Kimberly-Clark Corporation, any of its agents, employees or sub-contractors or anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, including, but not limited to, claims made by any utilities who have suffered damage as a result of the logging operations.
