

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENCE, that The First National Bank of Birmingham and John W. Durr III as Co - Executors of the will of John W. Durr, Sr., deceased, have made, constituted and appointed and by these presence do make, constitute and appoint John W. Durr of the City of Montgomery, State of Alabama, as our true and lawful attorney for us and in our name, place and stead, giving and granting to him as he shall deem advisable the full, complete and unlimited right, power and authority to negotiate for us and lease to Atlantic Richfield Company its agents, employees, successors or assigns, all those lands that are a part of the Estate of Jno W. Durr a/k/a John W. or J. W. Durr under such terms and conditions as we may from time to time approve in writing. We give to John W. Durr, as our true and lawful attorney in fact for us and in our name, place and stead, with the unlimited right, power and authority, including but not limited to the following powers:

1. To execute oil, gas and mineral leases, ratifications, rental division orders, royalty division orders to the lessee or lessees on such terms and conditions as we might from time to time approve in writing; and 2) To receive bonuses, delay rentals or production royalties from time to time and to deposit same in any such bank account as he may deem advisable to expedite the distribution of such payments to the owners of the property hereinabove described; and 3) The powers herein given shall continue until expressly revoked by us by instrument in writing and filed for record in the Office of the Judge of Probate of Shelby County, State of Alabama.


