

She owned the property until her death in June 1949. Her children were A.A. Bruner, Florence M. Bruner Bishop, Forrest F. Bruner and R.J. Bruner also known as Reagan J. Bruner. Her son, my husband, Reagan J. Bruner inherited the property through her estate at her death. He and I owned the property jointly as husband and wife until his death, on January 1959. I inherited the same from his estate which was properly probated in Shelby County, Alabama subsequent to the date of his decease. Upon the property was located a small frame house which we kept up from time to time and rented to produce an income. To my best knowledge, information and belief this house was erected sometime prior to 1920 and is still standing and is occupied by the tenants or owners of this property. At the death of Reagan J. Bruner. I inherited all his possessions and real property through his will which was probated in Shelby County, Alabama. Mr. Reagan J. Bruner had no children, and died without any heirs other than myself. I sold the property to Mr. Rav H. Cooper and his wife Frances W. Cooper, who to my knowledge, information and belief subsequently conveyed the property to Mr. James W. Butler, III and his wife Jennifer C. Henry E. Lagman
