To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Henry Good of Shelby County, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Helena, Montana, according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1830, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the last half of the sixth quarter of section thirty-two, in Township twenty-one of Range one East, in the District of Lands offered for sale at Helena, Montana, containing seven by three acres and being only one of the four parcels of four acres according to the official plat of the survey of the said Land, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, whose said tract has been purchased by the said Henry Good

Now know ye, that the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress, in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and, by these presents do give and grant, unto the said Henry Good, to his heirs the said tract above described: To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, improvements and appurtenances, of whatever nature thereto belonging, unto the said Henry Good and his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, John Quincy Adams, Secretary of the United States, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.

GIVEN under my hand, at the City of Washington, the fifteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and twenty three, and of the Independence of the United States the fifty-eighth.
