ITEM I

I hereby direct that all of my just debts, including the expense of my last illness and funeral be paid out of my estate as soon as practicable after my death.

ITEM II

Vance, now residing at Moulton, Alabama), in equal shares, and I devise and bequeath all of the real estate which I may own at the time of my death, wherever situated, and

ITEM III

I hereby nominate and appoint my husband, A. C. Bronaugh, as the executor of this my last will and testament, and I hereby direct that he be not required to give bond for the performance of his office as executor and hereby direct that he be not required to file inventories, appraisals, or accountings of any kind to the court. In the event my husband, A. C. Bronaugh, predeceases me or in the event we die as a result of a common disaster within 30 days of each other, then in that event I hereby nominate and appoint as alternate executor, my son, John F. Bronaugh. My alternate executor shall have the same powers and exemptions as those granted to my primary executor.
