

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION
OF
PELHAM YOUTH BASEBALL & SOFTBALL LEAGUE, INC.
AN ALABAMA NON-PROFIT CORPORATION

ARTICLE ONE

The name of the Corporation is Pelham Youth Baseball & Softball League, Inc.

ARTICLE TWO

The term of existence of the Corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE THREE

The purposes for which the corporation is created are as follows:

(1) To provide athletic recreation for the youth of Pelham and nearby communities, while aiding their development in physical education and training in clean, moral sportsmanship.

(2) To form an athletic organization that is non-denominational and which does not discriminate toward any person because of their race, sex, creed, color or national origin.

(3) To generally do all acts and things necessary or expedient for the administration of the affairs of this corporation and the attainment of its objects and purposes, including the power to acquire, hold, own, lease, and dispose of property, both real and personal, to solicit, accept, and manage contributions from all sources including private and public funds available for the purposes for which this association is organized, and to exercise any and all rights, privileges and authority which private corporations may exercise generally under the laws of this state relating to non-profit corporations.

ARTICLE FOUR

The corporation shall have no members.

ARTICLE FIVE

ARTICLE NINE

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in the Article Three hereof.

ARTICLE TEN

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a.) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b.) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

ARTICLE ELEVEN

Upon the dissolution of the Corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of all the liabilities of the Corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the Corporation exclusively for the purposes of the Corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, religious, or scientific purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under the applicable section of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Circuit Court of the county in which the principal office of the Corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.
