To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS by this letter of the 2nd of March, 1830, it is ordered in the General Land Office of the United States, a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Washington, for the said tract of land described in the said letter, "an act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said to the United States, for the amount of the sum of \$1,111.11, being one-half of the value of the tract, subject to State and Federal taxes, or interest thereon, and, &c., in the manner of taxes subject to State and Federal taxes, or interest thereon, as one-half of the amount of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said on the 2nd of March, 1830;

**NOW KNOW YE,** That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said on the 2nd of March, 1830, and to his heirs the said tract above described, and to his heirs the said tract belonging unto the said tract, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

It has and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances of whatsoever nature, therunto belonging unto the said tract, for ever.
