To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas John W. Lane, J. Bay and Agency of John W. Lane, has deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Montgomery, Alabama, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said John W. Lane

according to the provisions of the Act of Congress of the 34th of April 1830, entitled "An act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for the West half of the North East Quarter of Section Six in Township Twenty-two of Range one West in the District of Alabama and a) Carvatin and Henry and crew and Henry and crew and a) Carvatin and Henry and crew according to the official plat of the survey of the said Lands, returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said plat has been purchased by the said John W. Lane

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several Acts of Congress, in such acts made and provided, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant, unto the said John W. Lane and crew, the said tract also described, To Have and to Hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, therewith belonging, unto the said John W. Lane and crew and their heirs and assigns, forever.

In testimony whereof, J. Bay and Agency of John W. Lane, President of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made Patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
