

ASSIGNMENT OF NOTE AND MORTGAGE

Whereas, James M. Allen, aka J. M. Allen, Deceased, who died while residing in Shelby County, Alabama, was the legal and equitable owner and holder of a certain real estate Mortgage Note in the principal sum of \$45,000.00, dated June 30. 1987, executed by Glenn A. McElroy, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the undersigned, by these presents, does hereby transfer and assign, grant and convey, unto the said Betty A. McElroy of 558 Brookhill Lane, Montevallo, Alabama 35115, the aforesaid Note, together with the above described Mortgage held by the undersigned, securing the payment thereof. This assignment is without recourse and assigns all benefits of said Note and Mortgage to Betty A. McElroy which has previously accrued to J. M. Allen; except for those benefits and proceeds heretofore collected by said J. M. Allen through the date of this assignment.
