The State of Alabama,
Lee County,

I, Charles F. Little, of Auburn, Alabama, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me at any time heretofore made:

Item One. I direct that my body shall be given a Christian burial, in a manner suitable to my circumstances and conditional at the time of my death.

Item Two. It is my will and I do hereby direct that all of my just debts shall be paid by my executors, hereinafter named, as soon after my death as may be practicable.

Item Three. It is my will and desire that my children shall share equally in all of the property that I may own or be entitled to at the time of my death and to that end I do hereby give, devise and bequeath to my said children, to-wit: Mr. Willie L. Clark, James M. Little, Mrs. Emma L. Webb, Charles Felton Little and Mrs. Lucy L. Hammond, all the property, real, personal and mixed, of which I shall die seized and possessed and to which I shall be entitled at the time of my death, to have and to hold unto them, share and share alike, in fee simple forever.

Item Four. Having confidence in the ability and trustworthiness of my son, Charles Felton Little, and my sons-in-law, R.D. Webb and George E. Clark, I do hereby nominate and appoint them, and the survivors and survivor of them, to be the executors of this will. And I do hereby expressly provide that they shall not be required to make any bond as such executors and that they shall not be required to make any returns or reports to any Court as to their acts and doings as such executors.

In witness whereof, I, the said Charles F. Little, have set my name and affixed my seal to this and the preceding sheet on this the 9th day of July, 1913.
