I, C. Felton Little, a resident citizen of Auburn, Lee County, Alabama, mindful of the uncertainty of life and being of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament, hereby revoking any and all former wills made by me heretofore.

ITEM 1. I direct that all of my just debts, including the expense of my last sickness and funeral and the expenses of the administration of my estate, be paid by my executors hereinafter named, as soon as practicable after my death.

ITEM 2. I give, devise and bequeath to the First Baptist Church of Auburn, Alabama, of which I am now a member, the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) which sum of money shall be invested by the said Church under the direction of its Board of Deacons, in sound securities, the income from which shall be equally divided and one-half thereof applied to and used in meeting current expenses of the church, and the other half to be used for and applied to Missions; and my executors shall pay over this amount to said Church as soon as may be practicable after my death.

ITEM 3. There stands on my life a policy of insurance in the sum of \$1000.00, payable to the Baptist Orphanage at Troy, Alabama, and I hereby confirm the designation of that Institution as the beneficiary of that policy.

ITEM 4. I give and bequeath unto my friends, Dr. Dana Gibson Sturkie and Mary M. Sturkie, husband and wife, the sum of \$5000.00, in equal shares; and in the event either of them predeceases me, then the survivor of them shall receive the aforesaid \$5000.00.

ITEM 5. I give and bequeath unto my beloved sister, Mrs. Lucy Little Hammond, my Solitaire diamond ring, and if she

predeceases me, said ring shall be disposed of by my executors, or the survivor of them, as they or he see fit and proper.

ITEM 6. It is my will that my personal effects, such as household furniture and furnishings, and any jewelry not herein otherwise specifically disposed of, shall be disposed of by my executors as in their sole discretion they may deem fit and proper; and in the event either of my said executors predeceases me, or for any other reason fails to qualify and act as such executor, then the survivor or other of them shall make disposition of the property in this Item 6 referred to.

ITEM 7. All of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate of whatsoever kind and nature and wheresoever situated, I give, devise and bequeath unto the following persons in the following proportions, to-wit:

- (a) Unto my brother, James M. Little, 1/4th thereof.
- (b) Unto my sister, Mrs. Lucy Little Hammond, 1/4th thereof.
- (c) Unto my nephew, Charles Hubert Webb, 1/12th thereof.
- (d) Unto my niece, Mrs. Eleanor Webb Hayt, 1/12th thereof.
- (e) Unto my nephew, David Lawrance Webb, 1/12th thereof.
- (f) Unto my nephew, Leigh M. Clark, 1/20th thereof.
- (g) Unto my nephew, William L. Clark, 1/20th thereof.
- (h) Unto my niece, Charlotte Clark, 1/20th thereof.
- (i) Unto my nephew, Charles Edward Clark, 1/20th thereof.
- (j) Unto my great niece, Julia Ann Clark Wear, 1/40th thereof.
- (k) Unto my great niece, Mary Leigh Clark Sanders, 1/40th thereof.

ITEM 8. I hereby constitute and appoint as executors of this my last will and testament, my nephews, Leigh M. Clark and Charles Hubert Webb, hereby directing that as such executors

they shall not be required to make any bond or file any inventory of my estate in any Court, or make any reports or settlements in any Court whatsoever. I hereby give and grant unto my said executors the full right and power to sell any or all of my property, both real or personal, at either public or private sale as they may deem best for the purpose of paying the debts and expenses referred to in Item 1 hereof, and for the purpose of making distribution as provided in Item 7, all without orders of any Court. In the event either of my said executors predeceases me, or for any other reason fails to qualify and act as joint executor, then the survivor or other of them shall be the executor of this will with the same rights, powers, privileges, and immunities herein given and granted unto them jointly.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I, the said C. Felton Little, have hereunto set my signature and seal on this the 13 day of December, 1955, hereby declaring this instrument to be my last will and testament; this instrument being executed in duplicate.

I, C. Felton Little, a resident citizen of Auburn, Lee County, Alabama, mindful of the uncertainty of life and being of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby make and publish this my codicil to my last will and testament, bearing date the 13th day of December, 1955, as follows:

FIRST: I change ITEM 2 of my said last will and testament, so as to provide as follows: ITEM 2: I give and bequeath to the First Baptist Church of Auburn, Alabama, of which I am now a member, the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), which sum shall be invested by the said Church under the direction of its Board of Deacons, in sound securities, the income from which shall be used for and applied to Missions. My reason for making this change as to the particular bequest is my belief that there is and will be a greater need for such income for Missions than for current expenses of said Church. As to what Missions it will be used for and applied to I leave to the discretion of the Board of Deacons of said Church.

SECOND: I change ITEM 7 of my said last will and testament so as to provide as follows: ITEM 7: All of the rest, residue and remainder of my estate of whatever kind and nature and wherever situated, I give, devise and bequeath:

(a) Unto the issue of my deceased sister, Mrs. Willie Little Clark, in equal parts, per stirpes, an undivided one-fourth (1/4) thereof;

(b) Unto the issue of my deceased brother, James M. Little, in equal parts, per stirpes, an undivided one-fourth (1/4) thereof;

(c) Unto the issue of my deceased sister, Mrs. Emma Little Webb, in equal parts, per stirpes, an undivided one-fourth (1/4) thereof;

(d) Unto my sister, Mrs. Lucy Little Hammond, an undivided one-fourth (1/4) thereof. Should she die before me her part shall go to her issue in equal parts, per stirpes.

Adopted children of any beneficiary under ITEM 7 shall have the same rights as to gifts, devises and bequests as children by blood and are included in the term "issue", it being my will and intention that all of said rest, residue and remainder of my estate shall pass to my heirs as it would be inherited by them under the laws of descent and distribution of Alabama if I had died intestate, the only modification being as to adopted children as stated.

I do hereby ratify and confirm my said last will and testament in all other respects.
