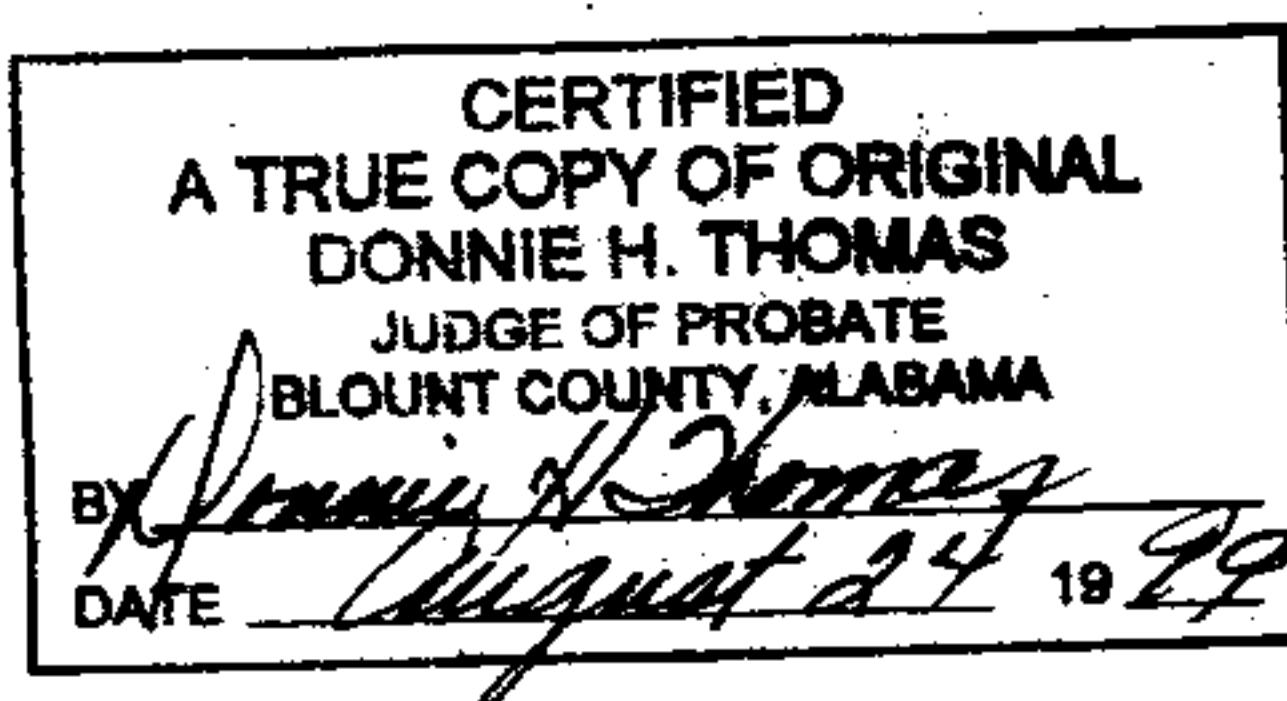

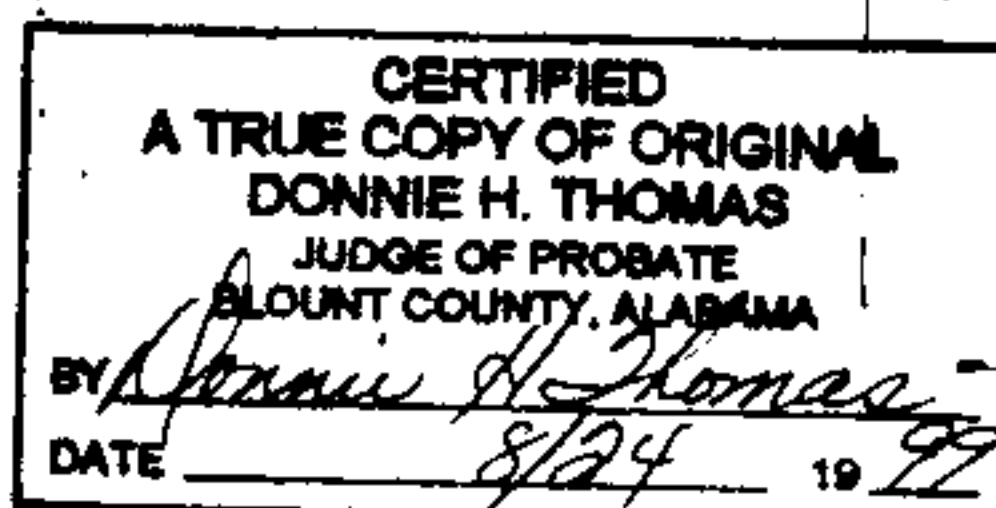

LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT

OF

JOHNNY DOLPHUS AYCOCK

I, Johnny Dolphus Aycock, a resident of Blount County, Alabama, being now of sound mind and disposing memory, do hereby make and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament, revoking any and all other wills and codicils heretofore made by me.

ITEM ONE

I direct that all of my just debts, including the expenses of my last illness and funeral, shall first be paid out of my estate by my Executrix hereinafter named, as soon as possible after my death.

ITEM TWO

All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate, real, personal and mixed and wheresoever situated, of which I may die seized or to which I may be entitled at the time of my death, I give, devise and bequeath to my beloved wife, Pamela Renae Aycock, absolutely.

ITEM THREE

In the event my wife, Pamela Renae Aycock, predeceases me, I hereby give, devise and bequeath all the rest and residue of my estate as follows: One-half (1/2) to my son, Johnny D. Aycock, Jr.; one-fourth (1/4) to my mother, Ruth Helen Aycock; and one-fourth (1/4) to my mother-in-law, Irene Booth, per capita and not per stirpes.

ITEM FOUR

If my wife and I shall die under circumstances that there is not sufficient evidence to determine the order of our death, then it shall be presumed that my wife survived me, and my estate shall be administered and

distributed in all respects in accordance with such presumption.

ITEM FIVE

I nominate, constitute and appoint my wife, Pamela Renae Aycock, as Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament, to serve without bond, and I direct that she shall not be required to file an inventory of my estate or make any accounting or final settlement thereof with any court or to any person. In the event my wife, Pamela Renae Aycock, predeceases me, or shall fail or be unable to serve as such Executrix, I hereby constitute and appoint my son, Johnny D. Aycock, Jr., as Executor of my estate, to serve without bond, and I direct that he shall not be required to file an inventory of my estate or make any accounting or final settlement thereof with any court or to any person. I give my said Executrix and successor Executor full power to do any act necessary to execute my Will, including the power to sell any realty thereof at private or public sale.

I, Johnny Dolphus Aycock, the testator, sign my name to this instrument this the 17 day of July, 1991, and being first duly sworn, do hereby declare to the undersigned authority that I sign and execute this instrument as my last will and that I sign it willingly, that I execute it as my free and voluntary act for the purpose therein expressed, and I am nineteen years of age or older, of sound mind, and under no constraint or undue influence.

We, the undersigned witnesses, sign our names to this instrument, being first duly sworn, and do hereby declare to the undersigned authority that the testator signs and executes this instrument as his last will and

that he signs it willingly and that each of us, in the presence and hearing of the testator, hereby signs this will as witness to the testator's signing, and to the best of our knowledge, the testator is nineteen years of age or older, of sound mind, and under no constraint or undue influence.
