- 1. To ask, demand, sue for, recover and receive all sums of money, debts, dues, goods, wares, merchandise, chattels, effects, and things of whatsoever nature and description which now or hereafter shall be or become due, owing, payable, or belonging to me in or by right, title, ways, or means, howsoever, and upon receipt thereof to make, sign, execute and deliver such receipts, releases or other discharges for the same respectively as my attorney shall think fit or be advised.
 - 2. To settle any account or reckoning whatsoever wherein I now am or at any time hereafter shall be in any wise interested or concerned, with any person whomsoever, and to pay or receive the balance thereof as the case may require.

To receive every sum of money which now is or hereafter shall be due or belonging to me upon the security of or by virtue of any mortgage and on receipt of the full amount secured thereby to execute a good and sufficient release or other discharge of such mortgage by deed or otherwise.
- 4. To commence, prosecute, discontinue, or defend all actions or other legal proceedings touching my estate or any part thereof, or touching any matter in which I or my estate may be in any wise concerned.
- 5. To enter into and upon all and singular my real estate, and to let, manage and improve the same or any part thereof, and to repair or otherwise improve or alter, and to insure any building thereon.
- 6. To contract with any person for leasing for such periods, at such rents and subject to such conditions as my attorney shall see fit, all or any of my said real estate, and any such person to let into possession thereof, and to execute all such leases and contracts as shall be necessary or proper in that behalf, and to give notice to quit to any tenant or occupier thereof, and to

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part thereof all rents, arrears of rent, and sums of money which now are or shall hereafter become due and payable in respect thereof, and also on non payment thereof or any part thereof to take all necessary or proper means and proceedings for determining the tenancy or occupation of such tenant or occupiers, and for ejecting the tenants or occupiers and recovering the possession thereof.

To sell, either at public or private sale, or exchange any part or parts of my real estate or personal property for such consideration and upon such terms as my attorney shall think fit, including credit sales, and to execute and deliver good and sufficient deeds or other instruments for the conveyance or transfer of the same with such covenants of warranty or otherwise as my attorney shall see fit, and to give good and effectual receipts for all or any part of the purchase price or other consideration.

In general to do all other acts, deeds, matters, and things whatsoever in or about my estate, property and affairs, to concur with persons jointly interested with myself therein in doing all acts, deeds, matters and things herein, either particularly or generally described, as fully and effectually to all intents and purposes as I could do in my own proper person, if personally present.

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And I, the undersigned, do hereby ratify and confirm and at all times to ratify and confirm all and whatsoever my shall lawfully do or cause to be done in and about the premises by virtue of these presents, and generally to do and perform all things necessary in or about the premises as fully and effectually in all respects as I could do if personally present.

The determination by my said attorney of my disability, incompetency, incapacity, or my recovery therefrom, shall be made in good faith and all determinations relating thereto
