JUDGMENT OF DIVORCE

THIS CAUSE CAME on for trial on February 22, 1995 on the Complaint for Divorce filed by the Plaintiff, Mary Gail Wray Hammond, and on personal service of process on the Defendant, Bobby Lee Hammond and the Plaintiff being present and represented by counsel and the Defendant having failed to appear, plead or otherwise defend against the Complaint for Divorce, the Court proceeded to hear evidence in open Court and at the conclusion of the testimony and the evidence, the Court rendered a bench opinion which is incorporated herein by reference and made a part hereof as completely as if copied herein; and the Court finding that it has jurisdiction of the parties and of the subject matter further finds and adjudicates as follows:

1. The Court finds that the Plaintiff is entitled to a divorce of and from the Defendant on the grounds of habitual cruelty, inhuman treatment and desertion.

2. The Court further finds that the Plaintiff is entitled to recover her reasonable attorney's fees of and from the Defendant accrued in the prosecution of her claim and the Court finds that the sum of One Thousand, Eight Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$1,875.00) is a reasonable attorney's fee through the trial of this cause and, the Plaintiff should be awarded judgment for the payment of said sum.

3. The Court further finds that the Plaintiff is entitled to the exclusive use, ownership and possession of a 1986 Lincoln Towncar in her possession and pursuant to the provisions of Rule 70, Mississippi Rules of Civil Procedure, the Court should appoint Steve Duncan, Chancery Clerk, as the Commissioner of the Court to do all things necessary to effectuate the transfer of title from the Defendant to the Plaintiff.

4. The Court finds that the Plaintiff is entitled to receive lump-sum alimony from the Defendant which should be paid at the rate of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per month until paid in full and the Court should enter a Wage Withholding Order to the Defendant's employer with directions that the employer deposit said sums to the bank account of the Plaintiff by the 15th of each month, commencing May 15, 1995.

5. The Court further finds that the Plaintiff should be restored unto her maiden name of Mary Gail Wray.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Plaintiff, Mary Gail Wray Hammond, should be, hereby is, awarded a divorce of and from the Defendant, Bobby Lee Hammond on the grounds of habitual cruelty, inhuman treatment and desertion.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Plaintiff should be, and hereby is, awarded her reasonable attorney's fees of One Thousand, Eight Hundred Seventy-five Dollars (\$1,875.00) of and from the Defendant, Bobby Lee Hammond, and Plaintiff should be, and hereby is, awarded judgment for said sum, to accrue interest at the rate of 8% per annum from and after the date hereof until paid.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Plaintiff should

be, and hereby is, awarded exclusive use, ownership and title of the 1986 Lincoln Towncar in her possession; and, the Clerk of this Court, Steve Duncan, should be, and hereby is, appointed as the Commissioner of the Court to do all things necessary to transfer title of said automobile from the Defendant to the Plaintiff pursuant to Rule 70, Mississippi Rules of Civil Procedure.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Plaintiff should be, and hereby is, awarded lump-sum alimony of and from the Defendant in the sum of Fifty-Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) to paid at rate of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per month which should be paid on the 15th of each month commencing May 15, 1995 with each payment to accrue interest at the legal rate of 8% per annum from and after the due date of each payment.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that a Withholding Order shall be entered simultaneously with this Judgment to take effect immediately erecting the Defendant's employer to withhold said sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per month from the Defendant's wages, salary and/or commissions, which sums shall be forwarded directly to the Plaintiff or deposited to her bank account by the 15th of each month, commencing May 15, 1995.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the Plaintiff should be, and hereby is, restored to her maiden name of Mary Gail Wray.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that all costs of these proceedings should be, and hereby are, taxed to the Plaintiff.
