# ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF Christian Literations

The undersigned, for the purposes of forming a nonprofit corporation under Chapter 3A, Title 10, Code of Alabama, 1975, as amended of the laws of the State of Alabama, do hereby make and adopt the following Articles of Incorporation:

#### ARTICLE 1: NAME

The name of the Corporation is: Christian Lice Fellowchip

#### ARTICLE 2: NOT FOR PROFIT

The Corporation is a nonprofit corporation under the laws of the State of Alabama. The Corporation is not formed for pecuniary profit. No part of the income or assets of the Corporation is distributable to or for the benefit of its members, trustees/directors, or officers, except to the extent permissible under law.

#### ARTICLE 3: DURATION

The duration (term) of the Corporation is perpetual.

#### ARTICLE 4: PURPOSES

- B. To establish and conduct a suitable organization to hold, manage and maintain the property and affairs of the Corporation all under and subject to the provisions of Title 10, Article 3A of the Code of Alabama of 1975 and the amendments thereof.

To exercise all rights and powers conferred by the laws of the State of Alabama upon nonprofit corporations, including without limiting the generality of the foregoing, to acquire by bequest, devise, gift, purchase, lease or otherwise any property of any sort or nature without limitation as to its amount or value, and to hold, invest, reinvest, manage, use, apply, employ, sell, expend, disburse, lease, mortgage, convey, option, donate or otherwise dispose of such property and the income, principal and proceeds of such property, for any of the purposes set forth herein.

C. To do such other things as are incidental to the purposes of the Corporation or necessary or desirable in order to accomplish them.

#### ARTICLE 5: LIMITATION

No part of the net earnings of the Corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributable to its members, trustees/directors, or officers, but the Corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article 4 (Purposes) hereof.

#### ARTICLE 6: MEMBERS

The Corporation shall have voting members who shall be elected (and may be removed) by the voting members and shall have all the rights and privileges of members of the Corporation. The Bylaws may provide for nonvoting members of one or more classes, who shall be admitted in such manner and who shall have such rights and privileges as are set forth in the Bylaws, but who shall not have the right to vote. The Corporation shall indemnify each officer and trustee/director, including former officers and trustees/directors, to the full extent permitted by the laws of the State of Alabama.

#### ARTICLE 13: COMMENCEMENT OF CORPORATE EXISTENCE

In accordance with Section 10-3A-63, Code of Alabama, 1975, the date when corporate existence shall commence is the date of filing these incorporation papers with the Judge of Probate of County, Alabama.

#### ARTICLE 14: DISSOLUTION

In the event of dissolution, the residual assets of the organization will be turned over to one or more organizations which themselves are exempt as organizations described in Sections 501(c)(3) and 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 or

corresponding sections of any prior or future law, or to the federal, state, or local government for exclusive public purpose.
