That said Weatherly Residential Association, Inc. claims a lien upon the following property, situated in Shelby County, Alabama, to-wit:

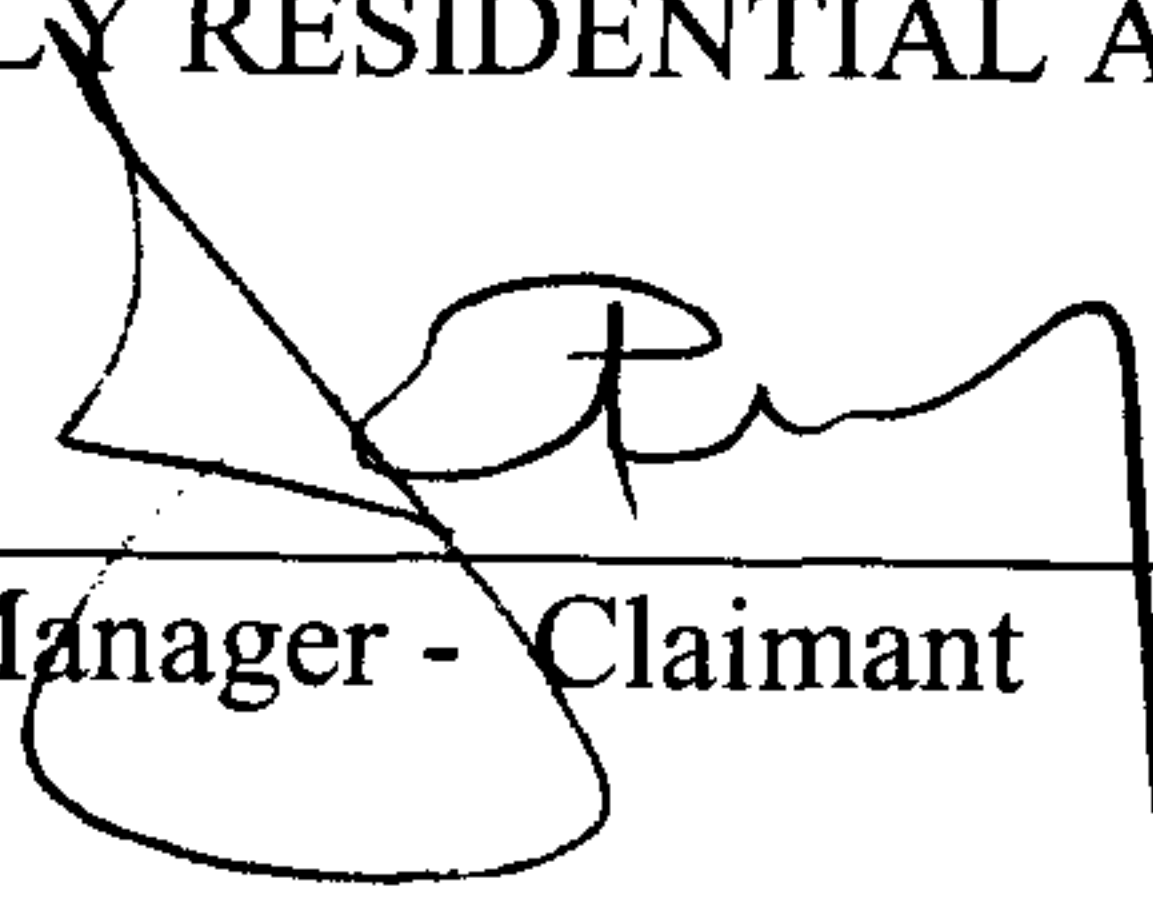

The name of the owner of the said property is Harold Washington.

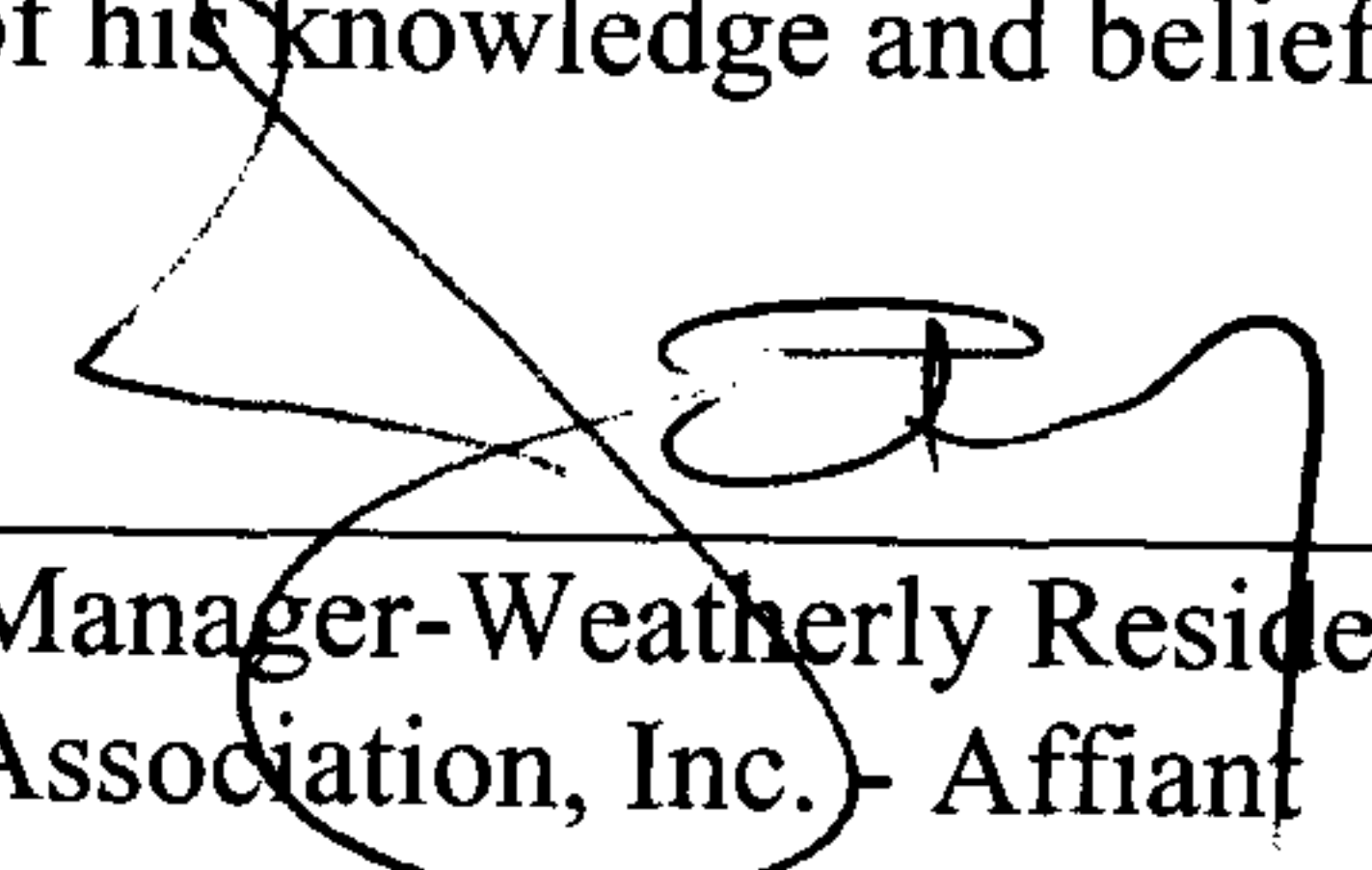
