Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 10574 for 40 acres, issued in favor of *William Blackerly Corporal in Captain Young's Company Alabama Volunteers Creek War*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *South West quarter of the North West quarter of Section Nineteen in Town Ship Twenty of Range One West in the District of Lands subject to Sale at Tuscaloosa Alabama, containing Thirty nine acres and Eighty one and a half hundredths of an acre*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said *William Blackerly*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *William Blackerly and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
