

ARTICLES OF ORGANIZATION

OF

SUPERIOR PLUMBING, LLC

The undersigned, for the purpose of forming a limited liability company under Title 10, Chapter 12 of the Code of Alabama, (1975), as amended (the “Alabama Limited Liability Act”), hereby file the following Articles of Organization with the probate judge of the county in which the initial registered office of the limited liability company will be located and affirm that the facts stated in these Articles of Organization are true and correct:

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of the limited liability company (“Company”) is **SUPERIOR PLUMBING, LLC**.

ARTICLE II

Duration

The Company shall continue in existence until it is dissolved in accordance with the provisions of the operating agreement, or, if there is no operating agreement or no provision in the operating agreement governing the duration of the Company, then in accordance with the Alabama Limited Liability Company Act.

ARTICLE III

Purposes

The Company has been organized for the purposes of general plumbing including but not limited to residential and commercial sales, repairs and installation. Further to engage in any other business or activity that now or hereafter may be necessary, incidental, proper, advisable, or convenient to accomplish the foregoing purposes (including, without limitation, obtaining financing therefor) and that is not forbidden by the laws of Alabama.

ARTICLE IV

Registered Agent and Office

The address of the Company's initial registered office in Alabama is **500 11th Street N.W., Alabaster, AL 35007**. The name of the Company's initial registered agent at that address is **Robert M. Polk**.

ARTICLE V

Initial Members

The name and address of the Company's initial members are:

ARTICLE VI

Management

The Company is to be managed by one or more managers. Each initial manager will serve until the first annual meeting of the members or until their successors are elected and qualified. The initial managers are identified as follows:

ARTICLE VII

Admission of New Members

Members of the Company have the right to admit new members on the unanimous written consent of the existing members. The existing members shall determine the amount and nature of contributions by new members at the time the new members are admitted.

ARTICLE VIII

Continuity of Business

Upon the death, retirement, resignation, expulsion, bankruptcy, dissolution, or dissociation of a member, or the occurrence of any other event which terminates the continued membership of a member in the Company, the business of the Company shall not be continued and the Company shall be dissolved unless there is obtained the written consent of all the remaining members of the Company within 90 days after the occurrence of the terminating event.


ARTICLE IX
