ITEM TWO: My son Homer A. Jackson, Jr. and I are now equal partners in the Public Accounting business known as Homer A. Jackson Company, located at 523 Frank Nelson Building, Birmingham, Alabama. Each of us is drawing one half of the profits of said business but my said son has contributed more time and effort to the conduct of said business than I have and I consider that he has earned and is earning the right to receive my interest in said business at my death. Therefore, I give and bequeath to my said son, Homer A. Jackson, Jr., any interest in said partnership that may be vested in me at the time of my death and I direct that such bequest shall not be charged to my said son or taken into account in any division of the other assets of my estate.

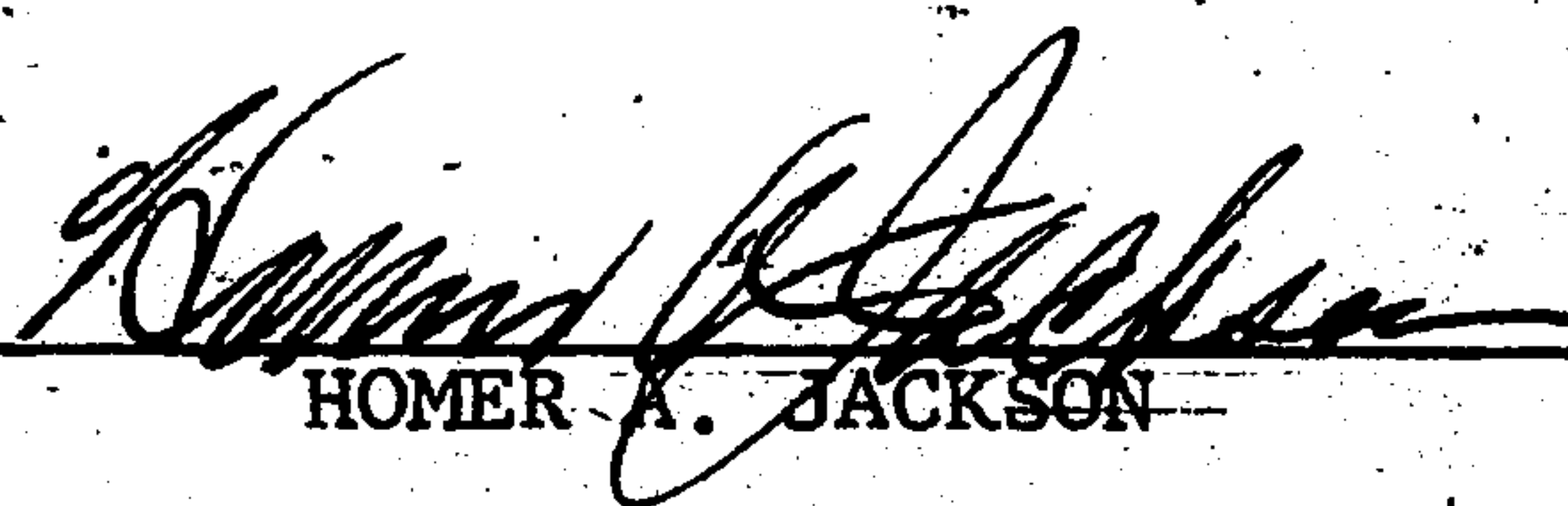

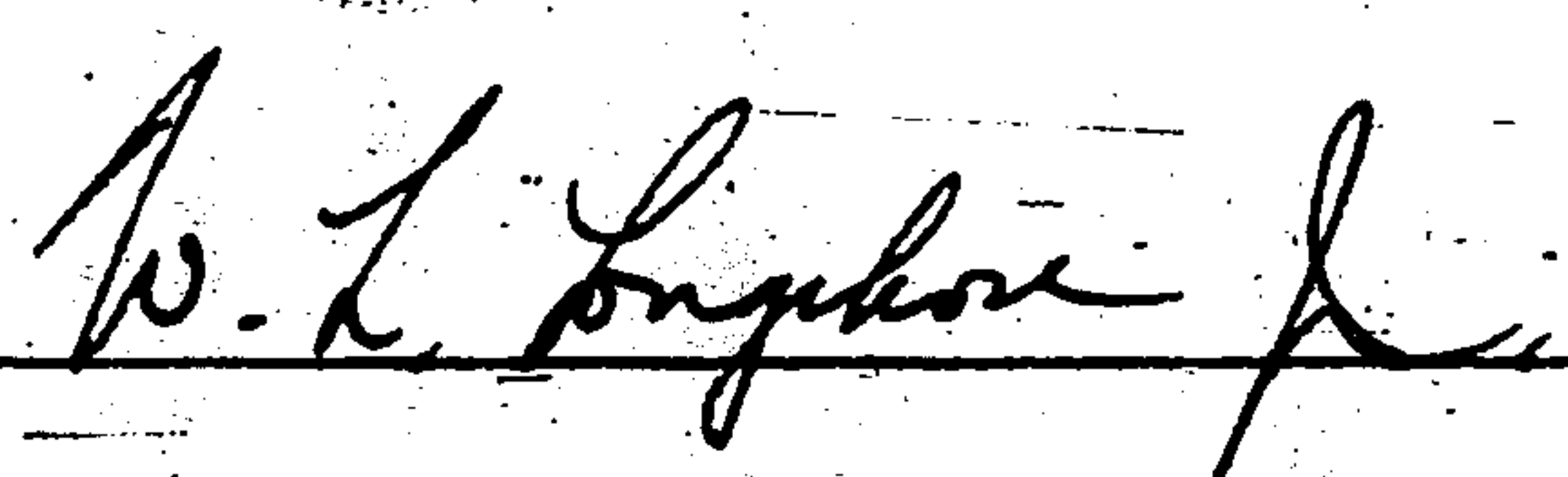
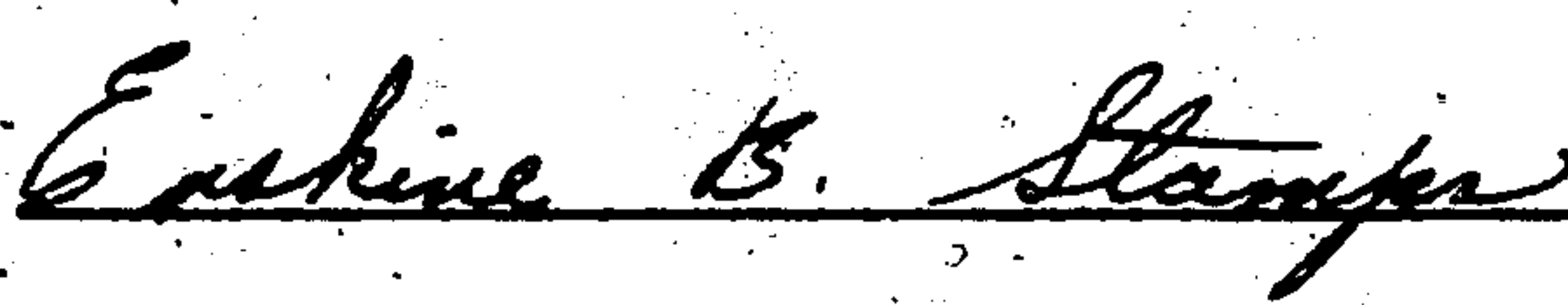
