KNOW YE, That in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An act to raise for a limited time an additional military force, and for other purposes," approved February 11th, 1847,

George Wink's father, and his, a son of George Wink, deceased, private in Company A, Third Battalion of Alabama Volunteers,

having deposited in the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** a **WARRANT** in *his* favor, numbered

THERE IS THEREFORE GRANTED BY THE UNITED STATES, unto *George W. Shortridge*, assignee of said David Wink and his heirs, the East half of the South East quarter of Section Twenty-nine, the North half of the South East quarter of Section Twenty-nine, in the North East quarter of Section Twenty-nine, in Township Twenty-one, of Range three West, in the District of Lands subject to Sale at Tuscaloosa, Alabama, containing One hundred and Fifty acres, and Thirty One hundredths of an acre, according to the official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the **GENERAL LAND OFFICE** by the **SURVEYOR GENERAL**, which said tract has been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said *parts of said* section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said

George W. Shortridge and his

heirs and assigns forever.
