

**THOMPSON SUMMER LEAGUE,
AN ALABAMA NON-PROFIT CORPORATION
ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION**

We, the undersigned, natural persons of age 21 years or more, a majority of whom are citizens of the United States, acting as incorporators of a corporation, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation of such a corporation pursuant to the Alabama Nonprofit Corporation Act.

FIRST: The name of the corporation is the THOMPSON SUMMER LEAGUE, An Alabama Non-Profit Corporation.

SECOND: The period of its duration is perpetual.

THIRD: The Corporation is organized to:

- To provide the youth of our area with opportunities for growth in both physical and character development through the baseball program.
- To provide direction in learning both fundamental and advanced techniques of baseball.
- To teach youth good sportsmanship.
- To compete and excel with excellence in the sport of baseball.

The corporation may exercise any, all, and every power which a nonprofit corporation, organized under the provisions of the Alabama Nonprofit Corporation Act for the above stated purposes, as it can be authorized to exercise, but not for any other purpose.

None of the activities, funds, property, or income of the corporation shall be used in carrying on any political activity, directly or indirectly, or in attempting to influence legislation. Neither the corporation nor its officers or directors shall, as such, contribute to or otherwise support or assist any political party or candidate for elective public office. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of or be distributed to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons.

Notwithstanding any other provisions of these Articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activity not permitted to be carried on: (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law), or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under Section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law).

FOURTH: There shall be a Board of Directors composed of Four (4) members. The manner of the appointment and removal of the Board of Directors shall be provided in the Bylaws of the corporation. The interest of any Director or officers in this corporation

shall not be assignable inter vivos, nor shall it pass to any personal representative, heir, or devisee.

FIFTH: The Board of Directors shall have supervision, control and direction of the affairs of the corporation, shall have authority to accept or reject membership, shall determine its policies within the limit of these Articles and the Bylaws of the corporation, shall actively prosecute its objectives, and shall have discretion in the distribution of its funds. It may adopt such rules and regulations for the conduct of its business as shall be deemed advisable and may, in the execution of its powers, appoint such agents as it may consider necessary.

All of the property of this corporation, and accumulations, thereof, shall be held and administered to effectuate its purposes and to serve the general welfare of the members. Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation to such organization or organizations as the Board of Directors shall select, which are organized and operated exclusively for purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

SIXTH: The address, including the street and number of its initial registered office is 149 Ashford Lane, Alabaster, Alabama 35007, and the name of its registered agent at such address is Pat Hamrick.

SEVENTH: The number of directors constituting the initial Board of Directors is four (4). The names and addresses, including the street and number, of the persons who are to serve as initial directors until their successors are appointed and qualified are:

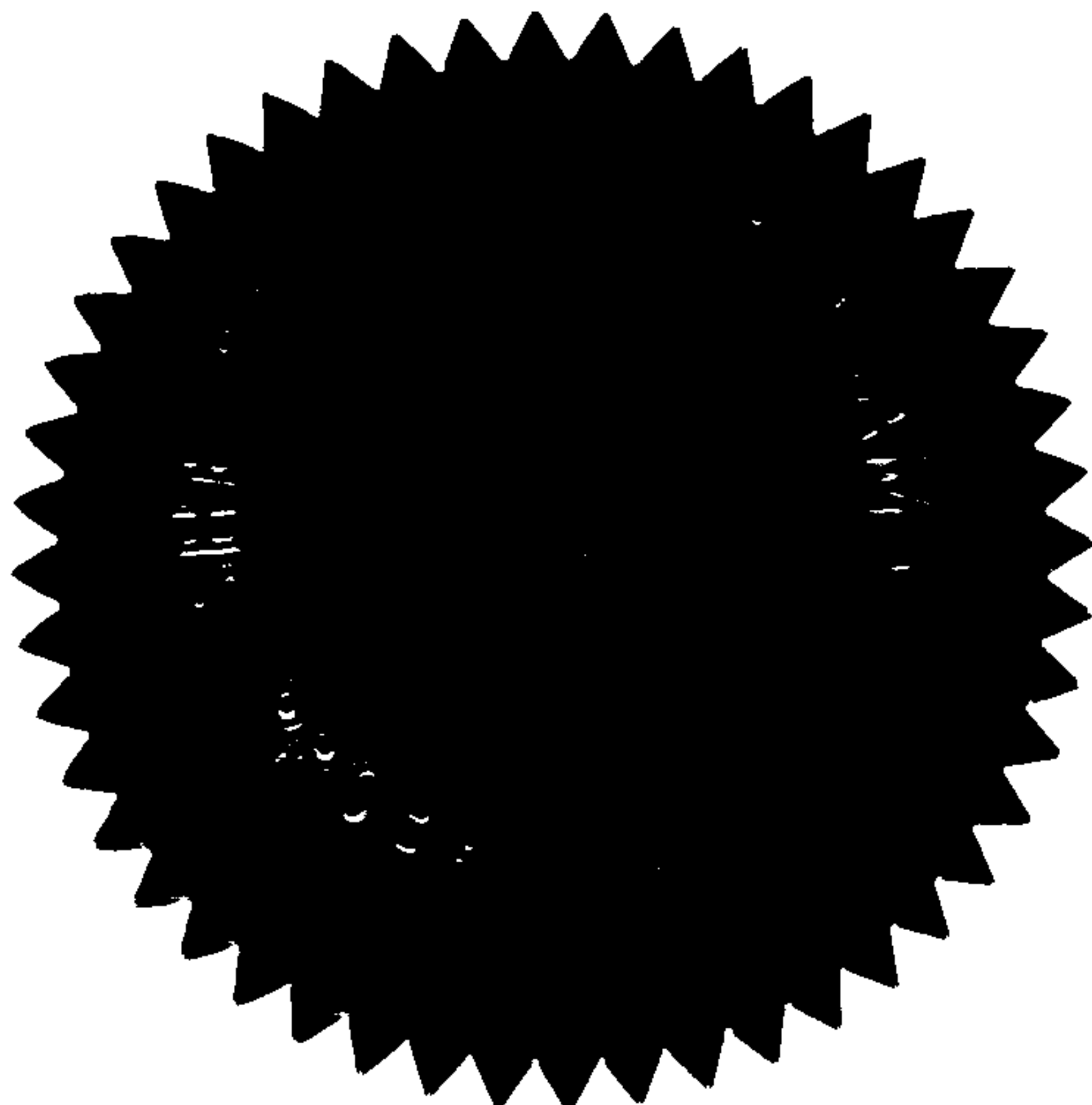

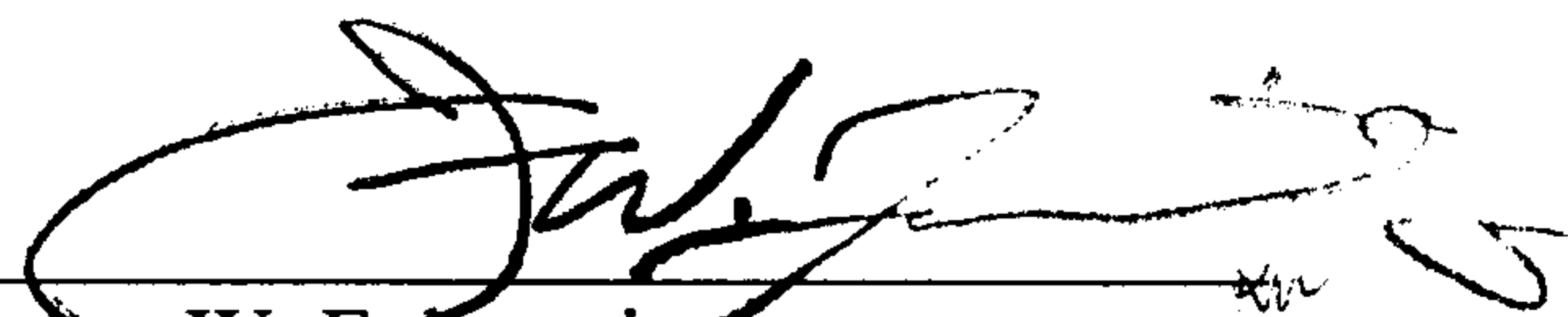
