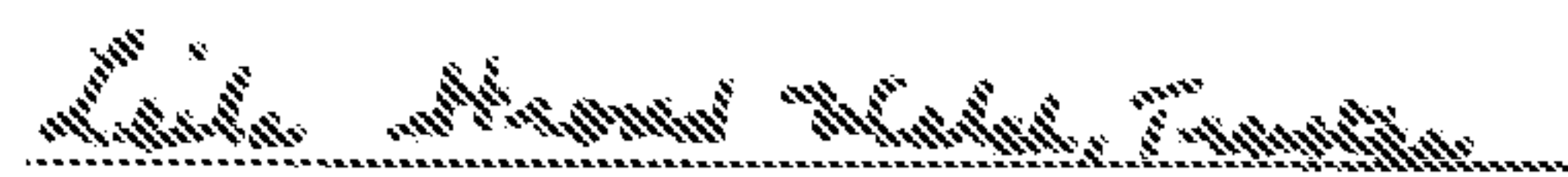
9. The Trust is irrevocable as to the appointment of any Decedent/Successor Trustees and there have been no amendments limiting the powers of these Trustees over trust property.

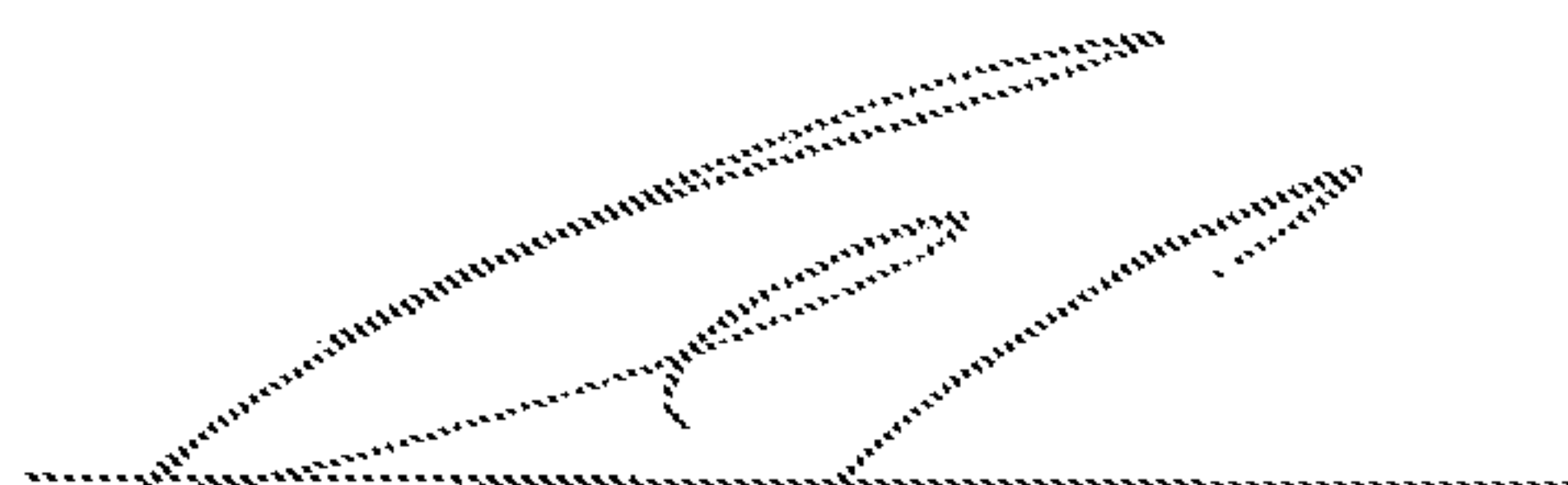

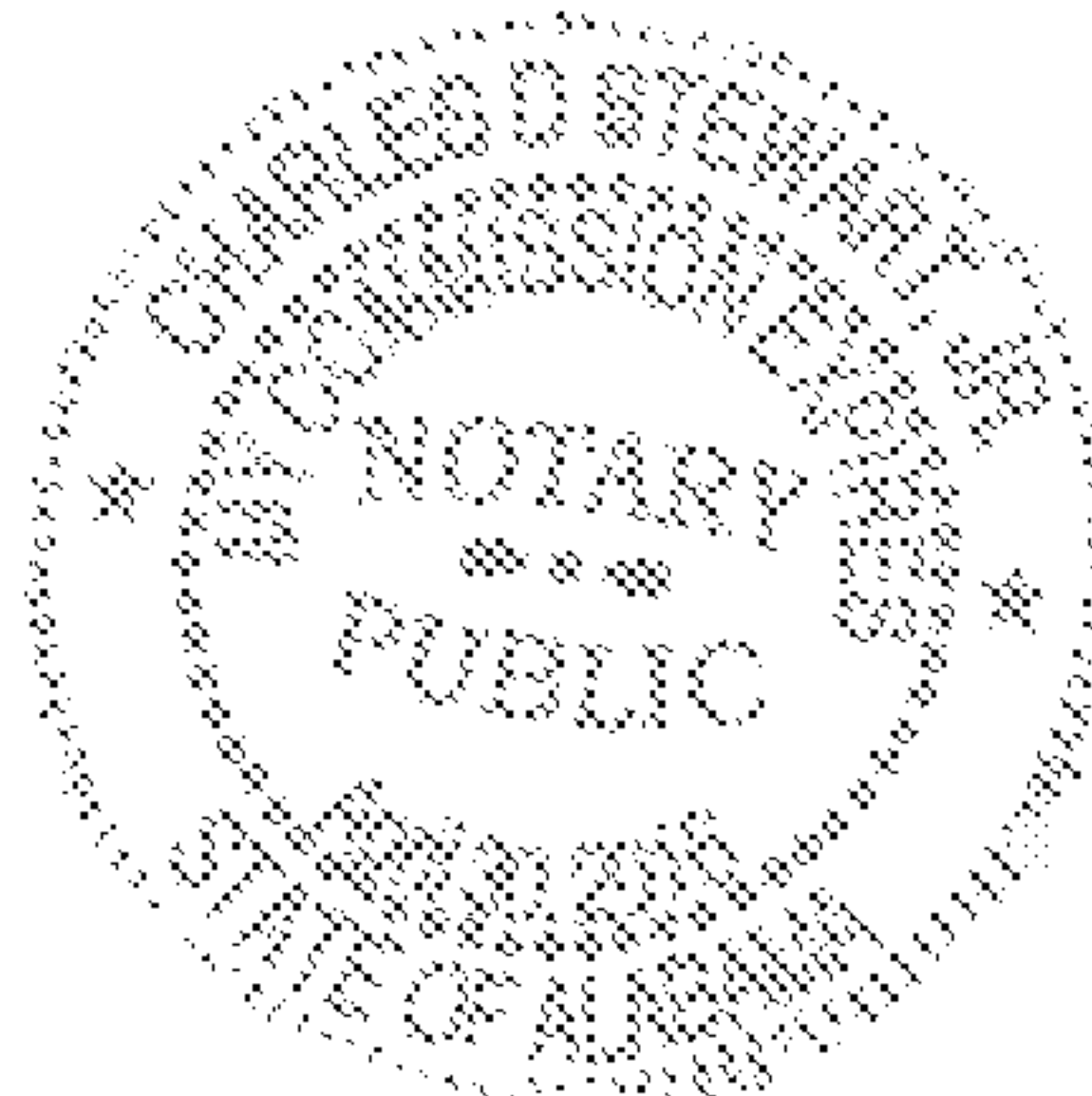
