POWER OF ATTORNEY

I. DESIGNATION OF AGENT

I name Rebecca Wise as my agent.

II. DESIGNATION OF SUCCESSOR AGENT

If my agent is unable or unwilling to act for me, I name Virginia Wiggins as my successor agent.

III. GRANT OF GENERAL AUTHORITY

I grant my agent and my successor agent authority to do all acts that I could do. I specifically reference §§ 26-1A-204 through -217 of the Alabama Code and incorporate by reference the authority described in those sections.

IV. GRANT OF SPECIFIC AUTHORITY

My agent may not do any of the following specific acts for me unless I have initialed the specific authority listed below. I have been cautioned that granting any of the following will give my agent the authority to take actions that could significantly reduce my property or change how my property is distributed at my death.

B58	Create, amend, revoke, or terminate an inter vivos trust, by trust or applicable law
135B	Make a gift that exceeds the monetary limitations of § 26-1A-217 of the Alabama Code, but subject to any special instructions in this power of attorney
ESE	Create or change rights of survivorship
B.5B	Create or change a beneficiary designation
BB	Authorize another person to exercise the authority granted under this power of attorney
	Waive my right to be a beneficiary of a joint and survivor annuity, including a survivor benefit under a retirement plan
	Exercise fiduciary powers that I have authority to delegate


V. LIMITATIONS ON AGENT'S AUTHORITY

An agent who is not my ancestor, spouse, or descendant may not use my property to benefit the agent or a person to whom the agent owes an obligation of support unless I have included that authority in the Special Instructions.

Except for any special instructions given herein to the agent to make gifts, the following limitation of power shall apply:

(a) Any power or authority granted to my agent shall be limited so as to prevent this power of attorney from causing any agent to be taxed on my income or from causing my assets to be subject to a "general power of appointment" by my agent as defined in 26 U.S.C. §2041 and 26 U.S.C. §2514 of the

(b) My agent shall have no power or authority whatsoever with respect to any policy of insurance owned by me on the life of my agent, or any trust created by my agent for which I am a trustee.

VI. SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

I understand that I may give special instructions concerning my agent's authority. I have no such special instructions.

VII. EFFECTIVE DATE

This power of attorney is effective immediately.

VIII. NOMINATION OF CONSERVATOR OR GUARDIAN

If it becomes necessary for a court to appoint a conservator or guardian of my estate or of my person, I nominate Rebecca Wise for appointment to either or both positions.

If the first nominee is unable or unwilling to qualify or serve in those positions, I nominate Virginia Wiggins for appointment to either or both positions.

To the extent the law allows, either nominee may serve in any such position without giving bond or other security.

IX. RELIANCE ON THIS POWER OF ATTORNEY

Any person, including my agent, may rely upon the validity of this power of attorney or a copy of it unless that person knows it has terminated or is invalid.

X. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

I am executing this power using the name "Barbara S. Baker." However, I am also known and occasionally sign my name as "Barbara Baker," "Barbara Sewell Baker," or "Barbara Sue Sewell Baker." My agent's authority extends to all my property, whether it is under the name I am using in this document or any variation of that name, including the ones I have listed.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR AGENT

Agent's Duties


- (1) Act loyally for the principal's benefit;
